AGREED ORDER ESTABLISHING PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION

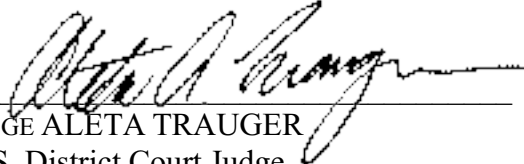
Pursuant to the agreement of the parties as evidenced by the signatures of their attorneys
below:

- 1) the temporary restraining order (TRO) issued by the Court on October 31, 2011 [Docket Entry No. 11] is hereby converted to a preliminary injunction;
- 2) the preliminary injunction shall remain in effect until such time as the Court specifically orders otherwise. Nothing in this agreed order shall restrict the right of either party under the Federal Rules of Civil Procedure to seek modification of the preliminary injunction or to seek a timely hearing on whether permanent injunctive relief is appropriate. Furthermore, nothing in this agreed order shall limit in any manner the terms and provisions of any subsequent rulemaking by the State of Tennessee related to the use of the Legislative Plaza, War Memorial Courtyard and Capitol Grounds. Finally, this agreed order shall not limit the plaintiffs' ability to challenge the legality of the terms and provisions of any subsequent rulemaking by the State of Tennessee related to the use of the Legislative Plaza, War Memorial Courtyard and Capitol Grounds.
- 3) the preliminary injunction enjoins Defendants from enforcing the "Legislative Plaza, War Memorial Courtyard and Capitol Grounds Use Policy" issued by the Tennessee Department of General Services on October 27, 2011 against plaintiffs or any other individuals, pending further orders of the court;

- 4) the preliminary injunction shall not require the posting of security by plaintiffs; and
- 5) the preliminary injunction shall not be interpreted to prevent state and local officials from enforcing valid criminal and civil laws.

IT IS SO ORDERED.
