WHEREAS the National Lawyers Guild groups chapters into regions and provides for Regional Representatives on the National Executive Committee, we propose that the Constitution permit regional boundaries to be assigned by the National Executive Committee, consistent with Section 6.2 of the Bylaws, which already permits this practice.

Original text: Each chapter and at-large member shall be a member of one region. A region shall consist of designated states (including the District of Columbia) or parts thereof, grouped together. The number and boundaries of geographic regions shall be determined by the National Convention. Each region shall be represented by one Regional Representative.

The number and boundaries of geographic regions shall be determined by the National Executive Committee. Each region shall be represented by one Regional Representative.
