NLG Disorientation Planning Guide (2023)

It's almost time for the law school year to begin, which means it is NLG Disorientation Season! To help law students at your school learn about the NLG, consider some of the suggestions below to set up Disorientation events. (*These suggestions are for already established NLG chapters. Preparation!

Here are some steps to get ready for Disorientation:

- Order materials: As a NLG law school chapter, you get access to print copies of the <u>NLG's Disorientation Manual</u>. Please contact Traci to find out how to order copies and other materials for tabling and recruitment.
- **Membership:** Get a list of current NLG members at your school by emailing Traci and make sure all your members are up to date.
- **National Student email list:** Check to be sure all members in your chapter are subscribed to the members-only NLG national student email list.
- **Contacts:** Make sure your chapter is listed on the <u>NLG Student page</u> of the NLG website along with current social media accounts. Email Traci with any updates.

Tabling!

Most law schools have an organization fair in August or early September to highlight student orgs. Make sure someone from your NLG chapter reserves a table and orders materials for tabling. Figure out who from the chapter can table and have a list of talking points about the organization to share with interested students! Some materials from the website you can use to prepare include:

Disorientation Events!

There are many ways to hold Disorientation events at your law school, depending on the size and capacity of your chapter. Here are some ways NLG students have organized DisO events:

• **Meeting**: The simplest option is to hold an open meeting of your NLG chapter and invite anyone interested in learning more about the Guild and movement lawyering. You can invite local or national NLG members to attend in person or virtually to talk about the NLG's work and mission. See the list of resources below for other content to help with planning!

- All-day Disorientation: If you have enough members and resources, your law school chapter can plan a longer event that includes a meeting as well as panels, trainings, and social events. Examples include events on movement lawyering or progressive career paths, Legal Observer or Know Your Rights Trainings, and happy hours. Consider partnering with other student groups at your school!
- **City-wide Disorientation:** If you are located in an area with other law schools nearby, the local NLG chapter may assist by planning a citywide Disorientation event over a day or weekend. Cities that often plan collaborative events include NYC, LA, Detroit, Chicago, Boston, Washington DC, Philadelphia, and the Bay Area. Reach out to your local chapter to see if there is a plan for a citywide DisO in the works!

Beyond Disorientation!

After Disorientation, the NLG also has resources to help you set up your chapter, organize at your law school, and participate in national campaigns! Check out some of these resources to start planning your yearly calendar:
